

ORDINANCE 2022-46

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH

AN OPIOID SETTLEMENT RESTRICTED FUND #2257

WHEREAS, the City of Lafayette is scheduled to receive funds as a participating political subdivision from national settlements with McKesson, Cardinal Health and Amerisource Bergen (“Distributors”) and manufacturer Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc and its parent company Johnson & Johnson (collectively “Johnson & Johnson”);

WHEREAS, funds are to be distributed to the City in accordance with Indiana Code 4-6-15;

WHEREAS, a portion of said funds are restricted to Opioid Remediation as defined in the Distributor and Johnson & Johnson settlement agreements;

WHEREAS, additional opioid settlement funds may be received in the future from pending, but unsettled, opioid litigation;

WHEREAS, the City may establish whatever funds it deems necessary and appropriate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

1. That there is hereby established a special fund known as the Opioid Settlement Restricted Fund #2257.
2. The contributions to the fund shall be the restricted portion of the opioid settlement funds received through the State of Indiana pursuant to Indiana Code 4-6-15.
3. Expenditures from the fund shall be made by appropriation by the Common Council for Opioid Remediation.
4. This fund shall be perpetual until terminated by Ordinance of the Common Council.
