

ORDINANCE 2022-45
AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AN
OPIOID SETTLEMENT UNRESTRICTED FUND #2256

WHEREAS, the City of Lafayette is scheduled to receive funds as a participating political subdivision from national settlements with McKesson, Cardinal Health and Amerisource Bergen (“Distributors”) and manufacturer Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc and its parent company Johnson & Johnson (collectively “Johnson & Johnson”);

WHEREAS, funds are to be distributed to the City in accordance with Indiana Code 4-6-15;

WHEREAS, a portion of said funds are unrestricted;

WHEREAS, additional opioid settlement funds may be received in the future from pending, but unsettled, opioid litigation;

WHEREAS, the City may establish whatever funds it deems necessary and appropriate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

1. That there is hereby established a special fund known as the Opioid Settlement Unrestricted Fund #2256.
2. The contributions to the fund shall be the unrestricted portion of the opioid settlement funds received through the State of Indiana pursuant to Indiana Code 4-6-15.
3. Expenditures from the fund shall be made by appropriation by the Common Council for any purpose approved by the Common Council.
4. The fund shall be perpetual until terminated by Ordinance of the Common Council and any funds remaining at the time of termination shall be returned to the City’s General Fund.
