



CSS/VSS User Registration


TID-Citizen for Citizen and Vendor Self Service requires users to re-register. This is the login screen presented when they click the login button in CSS/VSS home page. To re-register, click the “Sign Up” option at the bottom of the page. The user will receive a confirmation email at which point they will be able to browse back to the CSS/VSS URL and log in.

NOTE: Users will see a link to “Verify Email” in the confirmation they receive, shown below. This is not a required step for them to register or log in. If they do click this link and receive “404 Page Not Found” error, that will not indicate a failure to register. It means that the token submitted to TID-C for verification is no longer valid. The two known reasons for that are: 1) it's more than one hour old or 2) it's already been verified. The user can still browse back to CSS/VSS and log in.
